

## Food pantries struggle after SNAP cuts

RALEIGH, N.C. — After recent federal funding cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), food pantries across the state are facing a critical shortage. The Catholic Parish Outreach Food Pantry staff said they're working to keep shelves stocked but have seen an increase in families needing help.

#### What You Need To Know

- 1 in 7 North Carolinians face food security
- · It's the highest rate in nearly two decades
- Catholic Parish Outreach Food Pantry has seen a 60% increase in families needing food

It's a constant sound at Catholic Parish Outreach Food Pantry as volunteers tear open boxes and work to pack the carts to deliver food to quests.

"We've seen a real drop in the amount of food that's been donated," said Tommy Boggs, a 13-year volunteer. He said it's happened in just the last two years.

Recent federal funding cuts to SNAP are expected to impact thousands of North Carolina families.

Congress has reduced food assistance by 20%, ultimately affecting working families.

U.S. Rep. Deborah Ross toured the pantry, walking down the aisles and listening to what's at stake.

"Let's talk about who these people are," Ross said. "They're children, they're seniors on Meals on Wheels... they are veterans."

According to the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina, 1 in 7 people in North Carolina are now food insecure — a near 20-year high. Catholic Parish Outreach alone has seen a 60% increase in families coming in for food.

Despite the strain, Boggs said he and the staff, along other committed volunteers will continue to feed as many families as they can.

"It's tough," Boggs says. "But we're doing the best we can to keep food on the shelves and help people who need it most."

Pantry leaders say they're thankful for Ross' visit, and they hope it turns concern into action.

CPO was recently awarded a grant to feed families via a mobile food pantry (MFP) model — the grant runs until the end of 2026. It kicked off very successfully by distributing food to clients in the Kingsborough Estates (MFP1) in February 2025; so to date we have distributed enough food to serve almost 2,500 people. The plan is to add another MFP in September of 2025 (MFP2) which should double those served/month. Details will be shared in the next newsletter about the expansion.



# **ATTENTION: GORALEIGH ROUTE 3 CHANGES**

After years of requests, CPO now has a bus stop for our clients to pick up groceries and ride the bus home!

The GoRaleigh Route 3, which is the Glascock route, was realigned and extended to serve Brentwood Road starting around June 2025. The new route path is bidirectional along Raleigh Boulevard, and the service frequency was increased to every 30 minutes all day. The stop is located between Best Tile and CPO.
